THURSDAY 30TH MAY

RATHKENNY TO AROEE

Táin March Festival arrives in County Louth into the Historic town of Ardee. The March will be met by Queen Maeve at Moorehall Lodge for a re-enactment and display of artwork related to the Táin Bó Cualinge.

FRIDAY 31ST MAY

AROEE TO KNOCKBRIOGE

Depart Ardee at 10am and visit Tallanstown en route to Stephenstown Pond.

SATURDAY 1ST JUNE STEPHENSTOWN PONO TO

OUNOALK

The March departs Stephenstown Pond at 9.30am and proceeds through Knockbridge to the Standing Stone where Cúchulainn took his last breath. From here to Cúchulainn's Castle to take in the wonderful view. Arrival at Oriel Park at 12.30 to meet up with more of Maeve's Army. At 2pm the March arrives in Market Square for a re-enactment of the Táin.

SUNDAY 2ND JUNE

RAVENSOALE TO BUSH, COOLEY

Depart Lumpers at 9.30am and cross the mountain, up through Maeve's gap and down into Bush for 3pm. The March will be met by the Cooley warriors protecting the Brown Bull from Queen Maeve.
